What is about these derbies that pique the interest of football fans in South Australia? Hosting West Adelaide Hellas in the opening round of the 2023 NPL season at Service FM Stadium on Friday night, is a dream matchup. We have been rivals since the 1960s and this clash piqued in 1978 when it should have been billed as the 'Mother of all Derbies.'

We celebrate tonight that very derby when Adelaide City didn't lose the clash – we drew 1-1 – but at the same time watched West Adelaide clinch the title at Hindmarsh Stadium in front of a full house, more than 16,000 they said.

We're paying homage to that era by hosting some of the legends from that clash, the ones which have helped propel the club to become one of the greatest outfits in Australian football.

Can we bill this clash as a re-match of the 1978 derby, probably not. However, we remember that unbelievable historic day in SA football where we wore the strip which will be on display when we face our foes tonight. That derby draw was the turning point for Adelaide City in 1978, West never won a national title after that, but our club claimed three NSL titles, played in five grand finals and produced a plethora of Socceroos.

Their historic past feats on the national soccer league stage have encouraged our club to attract winners in every sense – off and on the park. Our current coach Paul Pezos has led this current crop of players to the past two NPL championships which was backed up by the treble last year.

Remembering last year Adelaide United – an A-League club which kicked off with about 80 per cent of our players in 2003 – had the shock of its life when our men took the Australia Cup tie to a penalty shootout where the Reds prevailed. Not bad for a squad of part timers. They will again do our club proud in 2023 as they have been working hard in preseason eager to continue the trophy streak.

On behalf of the Adelaide City board, we welcome the return of our members, fans, sponsors, and children that have all invested in this great club since it was born in 1946. We're a great community that have been torn apart by the Covid pandemic. However, we welcome every single person to reconnect the past with the present. Our goals our common – if we stick together. Please enjoy the new 2023 season.

# FOOTBALL DIRECTOR'S REPORT

It has been a very busy, challenging, and enjoyable time since taking on the role of women's football director at Adelaide City.

There are lots of behind the scenes work during the pre-season that makes this the busiest time before the season proper commences. With trials starting in October last year, allocating coaches and players to teams and arranging apparel fittings are just some of the major duties that have been a priority.

A month before the 2023 WNPL and junior girls season kicks off the club now has seven junior girls' teams, including three mini-roos' teams, with all squads at full capacity. The club's aim is to increase junior girls' participation next year to at least 10 teams. The major challenge we face is finding suitable qualified coaches to ensure our junior girls are receiving quality coaching to develop their skills and ensure they are enjoying their footballing journey.

Regarding the senior WNPL teams, the club's major focus is to increase their profile to a similar level to the senior NPL teams. The difficulty we face is the smaller base of junior female players, compared to junior male players and the supporter base that follows them. The aim is to increase the supporter base.

The senior women kicked off pre-season with its first match ending in a 2-2 draw with Football SA's NTC more than a week ago.

Two of our new signings got on the score sheet. Summer Doman put one past the keeper using her pace down the left side of the pitch and our marquee signing from Denmark Hannah Holgersen scored from the penalty spot. Our opposition equalised in the 97th minute in sweltering 36C heat. With several players out with injuries the WNPL team will only get better in the coming weeks.



# FOOTBALL DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Our NPL side is aiming for a threepoint after winning the treble last year. The club is a rich hunting ground for A-League clubs, as Daniel Bressan and Ayom Majok were trialled with Brisbane Roar in the off season. Majok was offered an A-League youth contract with Roar. Dakota Ochsenham trialled with Melbourne City this week so we clearly are doing something right in our men's football department.

Long serving Joseph Costa departs for State League 1 outfit Croatia Raiders as work commitments take priority. It has effected his ability to commit to the training loads expected of him at Adelaide City. We thank Joe for his contribution and wish him well with his new club.

We are also have new signings for the season ahead. Japanese Katsuyoshi Kimishima, 24, has played his most recent football in Indonesia's Liga 1 for Bhayangkara FC. Following seasons in the US NCCA competitions Kimishima impressed when he trialled for us and scored against FK Beograd in a 4-1 friendly game win.

We also welcome home Andrew Marveggio after he spent 12 years playing football in Europe. Marveggio is a defensive midfielder whose experience will play a critical role in coach Paul Pezos set up.

Also joining us locally is youngster Nicholas Francese (ex Campbelltown

City) and Augustus Williams (ex Adelaide Comets).

Pezos, now into his third consecutive season at the helm, has always had youth development as part of his focus. Last season had no less than six youth players making their NPL debuts in the successful 2022 season with three signing pro contract for the 2023 season.

Across our men's and women's senior camps, we are excited by the early signs from all our teams from U/18's to reserves and I believe we will be playing finals football again this season.

From a juniors perspective, our football department has had a major injection with the club announcing five new football coordinators/scouts that are dedicated and charged with coaching the coaches and players from our very young U/6s through to our U-17s. The team headed by Alby Troisi, the father of Socceroo James Troisi, has a background in youth development which took him to clubs in the major leagues of Italy's Serie A and the English premier league as technical director. Troisi's knowledge and experience has the junior players and families buzzing with excitement as the club focusses intently on junior development. Troisi is joined by Vince di Maria, Steven di Blasio, Tony Finamore and Dom Barilla.

# THE MOTHER OF ALL DERBIES

The promotion of West Adelaide to the NPL means that the derbies between Juventus and Hellas are back! 'To Adelaide soccer enthusiasts,' wrote Zac Drapac in a 1967, 'Juventus-Hellas matches have become as important as Celtic-Rangers clashes are to Glasgow fans.' This apt summary of the excitement between these two archrivals still rings true today.

The derbies between Juventus and Hellas (or in ethnic terms, the Italians versus the Greeks) were described as the 'highlight of every season' and attracted an unprecedented number of spectators: In the 1963 Federation Cup Final between these two football powerhouses, 7000 spectators attended the match. The large spectator base can be attributed to post-war migration statistics, with Italians and Greeks constituting the two largest migrant groups in South Australia.

Journalist at the time, Allan Crisp, highlighted that the rivalry was so important to both clubs that one would be inclined to believe that they would rather beat one another than win the premiership. And Crisp was not wrong - in 1969, Juventus and Hellas asked for the return of John Perin and Billy Birch from the Australian national team for their traditional clash (a request that was obviously denied).

The accomplishments of both Hellas and Juventus led to their departure to the National Soccer League (NSL) in 1977. The influence of these two teams was palpable – the Soccer Review remarked how their disappearance 'went down like a lead balloon' resulting in decreased attendance to SA league games.

Some of you may be wondering: why are City not wearing their familiar black and white strip for this match? This is because tonight the club is paying homage to an historic derby, held on 27 August, 1978. City's team at the time included players of an exceptional calibre including John Perin, Dixie Deans, Frank Lister, and Agenor Muniz, coached at the time by Les Scheinflug who took over mid-season from Edmund Kreft.

A massive 16,251 fans packed into Hindmarsh Stadium to watch Adelaide City, placed tenth on the ladder, try to thwart West Adelaide from grabbing the point needed to win the NSL Championship (then known as the Philips League). At this point, no South Australian team had won the national league. Aware of this fact, an article in the NSW publication, Soccer World, posited the question: 'So what will it be at Hindmarsh: fratricide or a peaceful family pact? Will Adelaide City try to prevent their neighbours from winning

the title – even if it costs their town glory?'

This looked likely in the 53rd minute after Perin unleashed a screamer with his left foot from outside the box – commented in the News as a 'typical Johnny Perin blockbuster.' Unfortunately for black and white fans, Vic Bozanic of West Adelaide managed to equalize in the 85th minute. An impressive long ball by Peter Boyle met the run of Bozanic who evaded two defenders to then volley the ball past keeper Peter Marshall, who could only watch as it bounced into the back of the net.

The game finished in a 1-1 draw, thus giving Hellas the vital point needed to surpass Hakoah on the ladder and win the 1978 NSL Championship, becoming the first SA team to do so.

As a neutral historian I wish both teams well for today... but the bianconera in me hopes to see a City masterclass as we claim the first 3 points of the season.

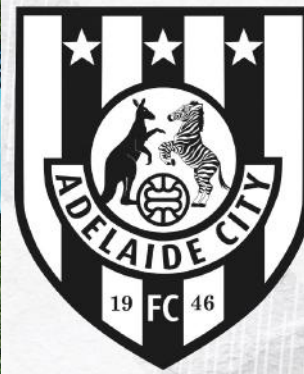
